A Deepening Thirst for God

In May, more than 85 TEE students provided feedback on the department's courses. Here are some of the comments they made:

"TEE has helped me as a leader by improving my knowledge of God's Word, teaching me discipline and responsibility, improving my communication and teaching skills and training me to serve people with humility and integrity."

"As an elder, it has helped me to preach and given me counselling skills to help the community and members of the church."

"It helps me in reaching people in need... helps in understanding the church and traditional beliefs."

"I am grateful for the lessons and the knowledge imparted to me through the books. I have deepened my thirst for God."

To Understand More

The group discussion time is the most enjoyable part of the TEE programme! Students meet each week to talk about what they have been reading and learning from the course books:

"We get to hear everyone's ideas and you get to learn more from other people's perspectives."

"It kind of brings people together and forces one to set time apart despite other competing activities."

"It was fun for each to verify his/her points."

"The sharing of knowledge helped in understanding the complex areas."

"When you discuss, you understand more."

Today's Topics

The students voiced the need to "address real-life issues, the practical challenges Christians face such as family life, evangelism, conflict, stewardship, youth issues, poverty and spiritual growth." They also included topics like technology, AI, and the influence of social media. They cited concerns about mental health, managing stress, and chronic diseases like cancer and diabetes. Students mentioned dealing with childhood trauma, gender issues, economic hardships and hopelessness due to the escalating cost of living. They highlighted the lack of community ethics seen in cases of corruption, human rights violations and social injustice. This feedback shows the pressures ordinary believers are facing in their communities and personal lives. We ask for your prayers as we equip them with practical, Christ-centred tools for life in the 21st century.

The Rendile Bible translates Matthew 28:19 with more urgency than the English word 'go'; it says "Run and make disciples".
